

Vevay Town Council
Meeting Minutes
October 7, 2025

The Vevay Town Council met in a public meeting on October 7 at 4:30pm. Council members Keith Smith, Jeremy Harsin and Lane Penick were present.

Jeremy Harsin opened with the public hearing for the 2026 budget. The proposed budget is \$1,376,316. After no public comments, Harsin closed the budget hearing at 4:33pm.

Harsin opened the regularly scheduled public meeting at 4:34pm.

Penick motioned to approve the September 2nd minutes and September 23rd special meeting minutes, Smith seconds motion, all in favor 3-0.

Penick motioned to approve claims and payroll register, Smith seconds, all in favor 3-0.

Strand will be milling and paving Arch & Cheapside Streets October 13-17th for the Community Crossing Grant project. They will also be patching road cuts.

The FEMA application for the April 2025 flood has been submitted. Clerk Scudder stated we are requesting \$73,068.00 to be reimbursed.

Sealed bids were opened for demolition of the unsafe building at 516 Ferry Street. Bids were: Parham Excavating \$13,460.00, McAlister Excavating \$8,725.00, TBG Earthworks & Maintenance LLC \$8,850.00, WG Construction LLC \$14,400.00, Earthshaping Inc \$12,000.00, Bovard Construction \$9,250.00. Penick motioned to accept the bid from McAlister Excavating in the amount of \$8,725 pending proof of insurance, Smith seconds, all in favor 3-0.

Smith motioned to approve the 2026 Holiday schedule, Penick seconds, all in favor 3-0.

Clerk had a request to install a sign at Jennings Park. Quotes will be solicited.

Water and Wastewater rate study has been completed. Public hearing and adoption meetings will be scheduled soon to be in effect by January 2026.

Leaf pick up dates will be posted on Facebook.

Town Marshal, Cody Miller, asked to use \$446.00 from the public relations fund to replace old rifles with new ARs. Penick motioned to approve, Smith seconds, all in favor 3-0.

Harsin once again requested a police schedule and stay on ordinance violations.

Miller requested a special working session with council on November 4th to go over SOPs. Penick motioned to de-commission one police charger, Smith seconds, all in favor 3-0.

Drew Hewitt asked if there will be an increase in clothing allowance for 2026. More info to come.

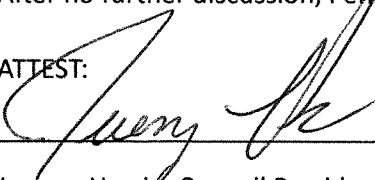
Tina Berkley at 605 E. Seminary St wants to know what she needs to remove and clean up since she was fined. A letter and photos will be sent.

Lane requested to add a fire plan section to the Use of Facilities application.

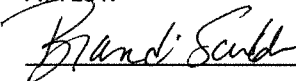
