

Vevay Town Council
Meeting Minutes
May 6, 2025

The Vevay Town Council met in a public meeting on May 6th at 4:30pm. Lane Penick and Jeremy Harsin were present, Keith Smith absent.

Penick motioned to approve the April 1st minutes, Harsin seconds, all in favor 2-0.

Penick motioned to approve claims and payroll register, Harsin seconds, all in favor 2-0.

Penick motioned to adopt the ordinance establishing the Natural Gas Fund #6401, Harsin seconds, motion passed 2-0.

Wheels on Fire Cruise In has kept the May 31st date, SCHS graduation has moved to 31st as well. Tom Moore has prepared a rough draft of the Emergency Action Plan for the cruise in and will need to be reviewed by Town Marshal.

Mark with SC Tourism stated the Switzerland County Innkeepers Tax was added to Indiana section 125, IC 6-9-76. It will go into effect July 1, 2025 but the County will still need to adopt an ordinance. Mark also asked to close Ferry to Cheapside from 10-3 on Saturday, May 10th for Goatauqua. Penick motion to accept, Harsin seconds, all in favor 2-0. The 50th Anniversary of the Movie A Girl Named Sooner will be in June, event details to come.

Penick motioned to accept the VSCF grant in the amount of \$3,000 for National Night Out to be held on August 6th at Ogle Park, Harsin seconds, motion passed 2-0.

Penick motioned to approve the Switzerland County Natural Gas Asset Agreement, Harsin seconds, all in favor. Attorney Doug Garner advised an updated final agreement will be presented at the closing when the IURC approves the acquisition.

Penick motioned to accept the contract from USDI Natural Gas Management, Harsin seconds, 2-0.

Clerk Scudder asked to open a bank account for the natural gas fund, Penick motioned to approve, Harsin seconds, all in favor 2-0. Pam Wilson will be moving the gas office to town hall on May 19th, but all operations will still be separate. Notice will be posted.

Doug Garner gave a directive to police dept on how to handle the abandoned vehicles. Council asked him to enforce based on the approved guidelines.

Employee Handbook proposal was tabled for more quotes. Only one was received from New Focus HR. Scudder is working with DHS and FEMA on park flooding damages.

Two HVAC units have not been working since last year and was tabled last fall, quote was received from Jeremy Jackson to replace both at \$13,200, Penick motioned to accept, Harsin seconds, all in favor 2-0. Scudder listed outstanding checks from the past two years for \$6,144.50 and requested to receipt back into appropriate funds, Penick motioned to approve, Harsin seconds, all in favor 2-0.

Duke will need to replace CT meters at Ogle Park from the flooding.

Penick will be installing onion bag box for litter at Ogle Park.

Lesley Kidd requested action for the mosquito problem and open cistern at the abandoned house at 307 Greeley Ave.

A special meeting will be held May 8th at 4:30pm.

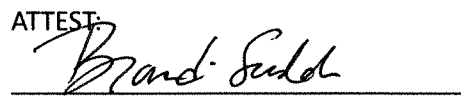
After no further discussion, Penick motioned to adjourn at 5pm, Smith seconds, all in favor.
